

At Catanzaro the II National Convention of the Apostolic Movement

13 and 14 March at Catanzaro, the II National Convention of the Apostolic Movement will be celebrated with the presence of the Metropolitan Archbishop of Bologna, the Cardinal Carlo Caffarra who in the second day will hold a speech on the theme: «Whoever is in Christ is a new creature (2Cor 5,17)».

On the first day, the Rossano-Cariati Archbishop, Monsignor Santo Marciànò, will hold a speech on the theme: «With age-old love I have loved you (Jer 31,3)».

While the Catanzaro-Squillace Metropolitan Archbishop, Monsignor Antonio Ciliberti, will hold a pastoral reading on the reality of the «Apostolic Movement witness of God's love among men».

The two days, moderated by the fathers Francesco Brancaccio and Gesualdo De Luca, will be introduced with the greetings of the Apostolic Movement's President, Cettina Marraffa, and Central ecclesiastical Assistant, the theologian Monsignor Costantino Di Bruno.

The Apostolic Movement, founded at Catanzaro 3 November 1979, through the inspirer and founder Maria Marino, approved and recognised by the ecclesiastic authorities, has had for 28 years, as its charisma the memory of the Word to the world, inviting man to conversion.

A mission «ad gentes» that the adherents translate into reality in Italy and abroad with the theological, spiritual and pastoral support of the numerous priests, whose vocation started in the womb of the Apostolic Movement, and of the male and female lay persons, some, among the latter also consecrated, that live the spirituality of the Movement.
